For The Love of...Man!!

Each of our religion's forefathers is mentioned as typifying one specific trait. Avraham was the epitome of *chessed*. His love of helping others was so great that even when in severe pain from his circumcision, Avraham ran out into the blistering sun to greet potential guests. What was it that yielded his amazing propensity toward doing *chessed*? Maharal explains: "The fact that one may love other people is due to the fact that he loves Hashem. For one who truly loves somebody, loves all the doings of that person's hands. Therefore, it is impossible for a person who sincerely loves Hashem, not to also love His creations [i.e. people]." Avraham, who loved Hashem to the extent that he was willing to offer his only son to Him as a sacrifice, unsurprisingly had a level of affection toward Hashem's creations that manifested itself in his seeming compulsion to do kind actions.

It is no wonder then, that when asking Hashem for a sign as to whom would be the proper wife for Yitzchak, Eliezer uses the following gauge: "Let the maiden to whom I say, 'Please, lower your jug so that I may drink,' and who replies, 'Drink, and I will also water your camels'—let her be the one whom You have decreed for your servant Yitzchak" (Genesis 24:14). For, who better a choice as a wife for the son of Avraham than someone whose love for Hashem is apparent in not only her love of His human creations but for His animal creations as well. The sign, then, was not simply to locate a *baalat chessed* but also to unearth a true lover of Hashem.

People often find it difficult to feel a true sense of love for other human beings. This difficulty is often attributed to the person's inability to find a common factor that connects him deeply to the other individual. Maharal explains that one is able to fulfill the commandment of *v'ahavta l'rayacha ka'mocha*, love your fellow as yourself, only when his self-love is based on the realization that he is created *b'tzelem elokim*, in the image of God. Once such a level is attained, a person becomes able to love his fellow on the same level as he does himself since his fellow, too, is created *b'tzelem elokim*.

Love has been described as the most intense human emotion. The feeling of love for the Ultimate Being, then, is certainly beyond words. May we, following in the footsteps of our mother Rivkah, come to an adoration of Hashem which is demonstrated through our actions toward all his living creations. May the dispersion of such a love yield the arrival of a time where all inhabitants of the earth live together in a state of harmony and tranquility.
